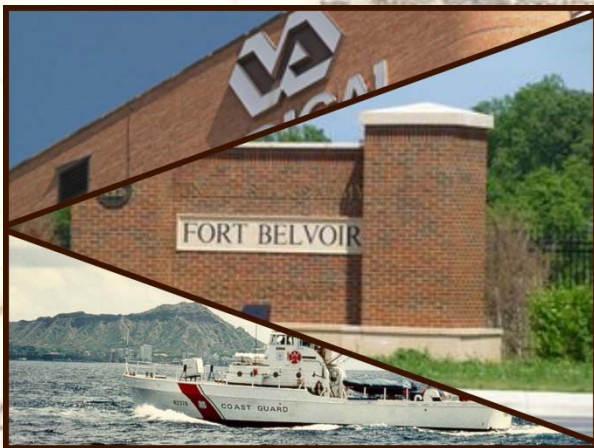

Our Engineers and lead technician, Jacob and Tom, have been traveling to the Overton Brooks VAMC in Shreveport working on replacing their main campus switchgear, transformers, and correcting electrical deficiencies. This VAMC serves over 37,000 veterans per year and has 111 inpatient beds. It is a Clinical Referral Level 1C Facility and HCS Group is proud to be working there.

Tom has also been to Fort Belvoir in Virginia this quarter. HCS Group was tasked with full design of complete airfield lighting replacement and repairing the electrical systems in Building 766. Fort Belvoir is a US Army installation. The base was built on the former site of the Belvoir Plantation. It serves as the headquarters for the Defense Logistics Agency, the Defense Acquisition University, and many other divisions, as well as being home to the Virginia National Guard's 29th Infantry Division.

Tom is also traveling to Costa Rica working on a project at the Coast Guard Station in Puntarenas. This station is new and was formed to deter both drug trafficking and combat illegal fishing practices.
